Dear Parents,

Enrolment:

Our enrolment process for the 2026/2027 school year is now open. Families wishing to apply for a place are asked to complete the formal application form, which is available on the school website or as a hard copy (being issued by post). Completed and signed application forms should be returned to the school office any time up to and including Tuesday, 11th November 2025, which is the strict closing date for applications. Please note that your child's original birth certificate must accompany the application form- this will be returned to you once verified. Original utility bills may also be requested at a later date as proof of address.

Parent-Teacher Meetings will take place during the week of 17th-21st November. Please note that students will go home at 2:00 p.m. on Wednesday 19th and Thursday 20th November to accommodate these meetings. A scheduling notice will be sent via Aladdin after the Midterm Break, allowing parents to book their preferred time slot.
